





Fedora 4 Genesis

- Fedora 4 started with meeting of stakeholders at Open Repositories 2012
- Decision to form a project around moving Fedora technology to next stage
- 2nd meeting in DC, Sept 17-18
- Decision to launch a Pilot to determine interests and use cases



Technical Goals

- Performance
- Horizontal and Vertical Scalability
- Flexible file system
- Support for Research Data Management
- Streamlined codebase
- Hydra and Islandora integrations
- Good test coverage
- Native RDF support
- Clear upgrade path from F3 to F4




