2016 Membership update

Although we welcome new members year-round, our formal 2016 membership campaign concluded last month. Many thanks to our members renewed their membership for 2016 and to those who have joined DuraSpace for the first time as new members. Here is where we landed compared to our annual targets:

Total: \$1,178,750; 159 members; 94% of target

- DSpace: \$248,250; 92% of target
- Fedora: \$564,750; 97% of target
- VIVO: \$270,750; 84% of target
- General: \$95,000; 119% of target
