- 1 New at Duraspace
 - a. Duraspace code of conduct. https://goo.gl/AGQ8Up
 - b. One web site initiative. Duraspace is planning to consolidate its nine web properties into one integrated WordPress site. http://vivoweb.org would remain as a redirected URL to http://duraspace.org/vivo. Look and feel would be consistent with new Duraspace look and feel while retaining VIVO content. Headers and footer would be consistent across Duraspace sites. Implemented in WordPress. Result would be much easier to maintain, and more functional. Likely an improvement in look as well, and lower costs.
