  - d. Where Fedora fits and should fit / Declan's thread
  - e. We should discuss how to tie tech advancement with strategy; there cannot be a vision discussion without including technology
- 3. Anual Review—need David's feedback
- 4. 2.5% contribution
  - a. If 2.5% of revenues from collection budgets and fundraising are dedicated to infrastructure and development to support open scholarly
  - b. We need to be careful with increasing contribution dramatically
  - c. How do we get credit for my contribution?
  - d. This is not a Duraspace- or Fedora-only membership drive; it is at a higher level where funds are put aside for this kind of projects in general
  - e. A brief write-up would be helpful to bring to Sr. management
  - f. It is a complex topic, and not new; it is very challenging to meet this goal
  - g. First discussion about this was about collections; now it seems to be expanding into technical infrastructure. There is staff time to consider
  - h. Accreditation needs to be validated
  - i. Talk to Cliff Lynch about a special session in CNI?
- 5. API specs update
  - a. First alignment with API specs sprint is concluding today
  - b. Aaron B. took on interim lead role in the last 2 weeks
  - c. A more complete update will be available soon as the sprint concludes
- 6. Oxford filesystem specs
  - a. This is directly tied to preservation concerns raised by community members
  - b. This is two things: an API to talk to storage and serialize contents
  - c. Andrew is involved in the filesystem layout and Neil in the serialization aspect
