- 1 Type search query and click Lookup button to search currently selected authority (i.e., LoC Genre/Form) (mockup action: Not functional in the mockup.)
- 2 Shows which authority is being searched.
- 3 Clicking Cancel button returns to edit form without adding any keywords. (mockup action: Returns to edit form without changing it.)
- 4 Clicking Save will add one selected term. (mockup action: No impact in the mockup. It will simply return you to the edit form without making changes.)
- 5 Clicking the checkbox beside a term in the Broader, Found, and Narrower columns selects it as a term. At this time, only a single selection is allow. (mockup action: No impact in the mockup.)
- 6 Clicking the external link icon takes you to the full LoC page for that term. (mockup action: This works for most terms in the mockup. A few go no where.)

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
